

# WW1 Llangrannog Remembers

The parents of Evan Daniel Owen Jones erected a pulpit in his memory in the church of Saint Caranog in Llangrannog. He was always known as Owie to family and friends and was tragically killed in WW1. The parish of Llangrannog includes Pontgarreg and his family home was Trecregin farm. He was born in 1899.
